- FIRST Sunday of each month, the second offering is for the *Ministry Center / Building Fund.
- <u>SECOND through FOURTH Sundays</u> it's for a ministry listed below.
- <u>months with 5 Sundays,</u> the second offering on the last Sunday of that month and is for **Christian Education. (Those months in 2025 are March, June, September, & December.)

JANUARY: G.E.M.S./Cadets—(half local, half headquarters)

GEMS and **Cadets** are youth ministries established in several different denominations and non-denominational churches, as well as Christian organizations. Our local **GEMS** & **Cadets** programs are made up of three Sioux Center Christian Reformed congregations—Bridge of Hope, Covenant and Faith. Both meet on various Wednesday evenings, September through April; GEMS meets at Covenant CRC and Cadets meets at Faith CRC. Read more about both ministries below.

G.E.M.S. (Girls Everywhere Meeting the Savior) is a ministry for *girls in grades 4 through 8*. The purpose of this ministry is to "encourage each girl to serve the Lord with sincerity and integrity while raising awareness of her responsibility in God's world." FEBRUARY: Hope Food Pantry—

MARCH: Mid-Sioux Opportunity, Inc.—

Mid-Sioux is a not-for-profit Community Action Agency established to fight poverty at a local level by assisting low-income families in Northwest lowa to become self-sufficient. Some of the services offered include help with rent, utilities, gas, medicine and other bills in a crisis situation. Their Food Pantry enables them to provide people in need with a three-day supply of food & toiletry items. They also distribute donated school supplies for area children and help families in need with special meals during the holiday season. APRIL: Sack Pack Sioux Center-

The Sack Pack Program offers free meals & snacks for kids to take home from school on weekends. The packs contain individually packaged food that is ready to eat or easily prepared in the microwave. It's supported by *Hunger Free Kids of Sioux County* and local communities. Sack Pack Sioux Center is headquartered in the H.O.M.E. building and volunteers/groups currently pack sacks for 270 kids every week.

MAY: Inspiration Hills Camp and Retreat Center—

Inspiration Hills' mission is to provide an environment for the individual to come to know and grow in Christ and be challenged for life in God's Kingdom. JUNE: Cornerstone Prison Church-

AUGUST: Winter Warm Up-

Providing winter gear for those in need, from infants to adults, making sure everyone in our community has access to warm clothing for free during Iowa's bitter cold months.

SEPTEMBER: Bridge of Hope's Hope Fund—

This fund is used to help those in our congregation in times of need.

OCTOBER: ATLAS of Sioux Center-

A.T.L.A.S. (Attaining Truth Love And Self-control) is a Christ-centered ministry that provides personal development services to individuals and families who are hurting for a variety of reasons. Center. The evening begins as a large group gathering which consists of worship and a lesson. Two smaller, gender-based groups are then formed. These groups seek to be places of acceptance and confidentiality.

*Ministry Center / Building Fund

An offering for this fund will be taken the first Sunday of each month. While the Ministry Center was paid off in 2023, ongoing expenses occur and with increased staff and the potential of additional office and storage space, it's important to keep looking to the future as we grow and have adequate funds available to expand if needed. While we aren't actively raising money for the purpose of a future permanent home for Bridge of Hope, building money in this fund, along with equity in the Ministry Center, would someday help fund a permanent location.
